

"The Spirit" (verses)

[Gen 41:38-39 NIV] 38 So Pharaoh asked them, "Can we find anyone like this man, one **in whom** is the spirit of God?" 39 Then Pharaoh said to Joseph, "Since God has made all this known to you, there is no one so **discerning and wise** as you.

[Exo 31:2-3 NIV] 2 "See, I have chosen Bezalel son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah, 3 and I have **filled him** with the Spirit of God, with **wisdom, with understanding, with knowledge and with all kinds of skills**—

[Num 11:16-17 NIV] 16 The LORD said to Moses: "Bring me seventy of Israel's elders who are known to you as leaders and officials among the people. Have them come to the tent of meeting, that they may stand there with you. 17 I will come down and speak with you there, and **I will take some of the power of the Spirit that is on you and put it on them**. They will share the burden of the people with you so that **you will not have to carry it alone**.

[Num 11:25 NIV] 25 Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke with him, and he took some of the **power of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied--but did not do so again**.

[Num 11:26 NIV] 26 However, two men, whose names were **Eldad and Medad**, had remained in the camp. They were listed among the elders, but did not go out to the tent. **Yet the Spirit also rested on them**, and they prophesied in the camp.

[Num 24:1-4 NIV] 1 Now when **Balaam** saw that it pleased the LORD to bless Israel, **he did not resort to divination** as at other times, but turned his face toward the wilderness. 2 When Balaam looked out and saw Israel encamped tribe by tribe, **the Spirit of God came on him** 3 and he spoke his message: "The prophecy of Balaam son of Beor, the prophecy of one whose eye sees clearly, 4 the prophecy of one who **hears the words of God, who sees a vision from the Almighty, who falls prostrate, and whose eyes are opened**:

[Num 27:18 NIV] 18 So the LORD said to Moses, "Take Joshua son of Nun, a man in whom is the spirit of leadership, and **lay your hand on him**.

[Deu 34:9 NIV] 9 **Now Joshua son of Nun was filled with the spirit of wisdom because Moses had laid his hands on him**. So the Israelites listened to him and did what the LORD had commanded Moses.

[Jdg 3:9-10 NIV] 9 But when they **cried out to the LORD, he raised up for them a deliverer**, Othniel son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother, who saved them. 10 **The Spirit of the LORD came on him**, so that he became Israel's **judge and went to war**. The LORD gave Cushan-Rishathaim king of Aram into the hands of Othniel, who **overpowered** him.

[Jdg 13:25 NIV] (**SAMSON**) 25 and **the Spirit of the LORD began to stir him** while he was in Mahaneh Dan, between Zorah and Eshtaol.

[Jdg 14:6, 19 NIV] 6 The **Spirit of the LORD came powerfully upon him so that he tore the lion apart** with his bare hands as he might have torn a young goat. But he told neither his father nor his mother what he had done. ... 19 Then the Spirit of the LORD came powerfully upon him. He went down to Ashkelon, struck down thirty of their men, stripped them of everything and gave their clothes to those who had explained the riddle. Burning with anger, he returned to his father's home.

[Jdg 15:14 NIV] 14 As he approached Lehi, the Philistines came toward him shouting. **The Spirit of the LORD came powerfully upon him**. The ropes on his arms became like charred flax, and the bindings dropped from his hands.

[1Sa 10:1, 6-7, 9-12 NIV] 1 Then **Samuel** took a flask of olive oil and poured it on **Saul's** head and kissed him, saying, "Has not **the LORD anointed you ruler** over his inheritance? ... 6 The Spirit of the LORD **will come powerfully upon you, and you will prophesy with them**; and you will be changed into a different person. 7 **Once these signs are fulfilled, do whatever your hand finds to do, for God is with you**. ... 9 As Saul turned to leave Samuel, God changed Saul's heart, and all these signs were fulfilled that day. 10 When he and his servant arrived at Gibeah, a procession of prophets met him; **the Spirit of God came powerfully upon him, and he joined in their prophesying**. 11 When all those who had formerly known him saw him prophesying with the prophets, they asked each other, "What is this that has happened to the son of Kish? Is Saul also among the prophets?" 12 A man who lived there answered, "And who is their father?" So it became a saying: "Is Saul also among the prophets?"

[1Sa 11:6 NIV] 6 When **Saul** heard their words, **the Spirit of God came powerfully upon him, and he burned with anger**.

[1Sa 16:13-14, 23 NIV] 13 So **Samuel** took the horn of oil and anointed him in the presence of his brothers, and from that day on **the Spirit of the LORD came powerfully upon David**. Samuel then went to Ramah. 14 Now **the Spirit of the**

LORD had departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the LORD tormented him. ... 23 Whenever the spirit from God came on Saul, David would take up his lyre and play. Then relief would come to Saul; he would feel better, and the evil spirit would leave him.

[1Sa 19:20, 23 NIV] 20 so he sent men to capture him. But when they saw a group of prophets prophesying, with Samuel standing there as their leader, the **Spirit of God came on Saul's men, and they also prophesied.** ... 23 So Saul went to Naioth at Ramah. But **the Spirit of God came even on him, and he walked along prophesying until he came to Naioth.**

[2Sa 23:2 NIV] 2 "The Spirit of the LORD **spoke through me** (DAVID); his word was on my tongue.

[1Ki 18:12 NIV] 12 (OBADIAH) I don't know where the Spirit of the LORD **may carry you** (ELIJAH) when I leave you. If I go and tell Ahab and he doesn't find you, he will kill me. Yet I your servant have worshiped the LORD since my youth.

[1Ki 22:19-25 NIV] 19 **Micaiah** continued, "Therefore hear the word of the LORD: I saw the LORD sitting on his throne with all the multitudes of heaven standing around him on his right and on his left. 20 And the LORD said, 'Who will entice Ahab into attacking Ramoth Gilead and going to his death there?' "One suggested this, and another that. 21 Finally, **a spirit came forward**, stood before the LORD and said, 'I will entice him.' 22 " 'By what means?' the LORD asked. " 'I will go out and be **a deceiving spirit** in the mouths of all his prophets,' he said. " 'You will succeed in enticing him,' said the LORD. 'Go and do it.' 23 "So now the LORD has put a deceiving spirit in the mouths of all these prophets of yours. The LORD has decreed disaster for you." 24 Then Zedekiah son of Kenaanah went up and slapped Micaiah in the face. **"Which way did the spirit from the LORD go when he went from me to speak to you?"** he asked. 25 Micaiah replied, "You will find out on the day you go to hide in an inner room."

[Jhn 3:8 NIV] 8 The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. **So it is with everyone born of the Spirit.**"

[2Ki 2:3-18 NIV] 3 The **company of the prophets** at Bethel came out to Elisha and asked, **"Do you know that the LORD is going to take your master from you today?"** "Yes, I know," Elisha replied, **"so be quiet."** 4 Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here, Elisha; the LORD has sent me to Jericho." And he replied, "As surely as the LORD lives and as you live, I will not leave you." So they went to Jericho. 5 The

company of the prophets at Jericho went up to Elisha and asked him, "**Do you know that the LORD is going to take your master from you today?**" "**Yes, I know,**" he replied, "**so be quiet.**" 6 Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here; the LORD has sent me to the Jordan." And he replied, "As surely as the LORD lives and as you live, I will not leave you." So the two of them walked on. 7 **Fifty men from the company of the prophets** went and stood at a distance, facing the place where Elijah and Elisha had stopped at the Jordan. 8 **Elijah took his cloak, rolled it up and struck the water with it. The water divided to the right and to the left, and the two of them crossed over on dry ground.** 9 When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you?" "**Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit,**" Elisha replied. 10 "You have asked a difficult thing," Elijah said, "yet if you see me when I am taken from you, it will be yours-- otherwise, it will not." 11 As they were walking along and talking together, suddenly a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind. 12 **Elisha saw this** and cried out, "My father! My father! The chariots and horsemen of Israel!" And Elisha saw him no more. Then he took hold of his garment and tore it in two. 13 Elisha then picked up Elijah's cloak that had fallen from him and went back and stood on the bank of the Jordan. 14 He took the cloak that had fallen from Elijah and struck the water with it. "Where now is the LORD, the God of Elijah?" he asked. When he struck the water, it divided to the right and to the left, and he crossed over. 15 **The company of the prophets from Jericho, who were watching**, said, "**The spirit of Elijah is resting on Elisha.**" And they went to meet him and bowed to the ground before him. 16 "Look," they said, "we your servants have fifty able men. Let them go and look for your master. Perhaps the Spirit of the LORD has picked him up and set him down on some mountain or in some valley." "No," Elisha replied, "do not send them." 17 But they persisted until he was too embarrassed to refuse. So he said, "Send them." And they sent fifty men, who searched for three days but did not find him. 18 When they returned to Elisha, who was staying in Jericho, he said to them, "Didn't I tell you not to go?"

[2Ki 2:19-22 NIV] 19 The people of the city said to Elisha, "Look, our lord, this town is well situated, as you can see, but the water is bad and the land is unproductive." 20 "Bring me a new bowl," he said, "and put salt in it." So they brought it to him. 21 Then he went out to the spring and threw the salt into it, saying, "**This is what the LORD says: 'I have healed this water. Never again will it cause death or make the land unproductive.'**" 22 **And the water has remained pure to this day,** according to the word Elisha had spoken.

[1Ch 5:26 NIV] 26 So the God of Israel **stirred up the spirit** of Pul king of Assyria (that is, Tiglath-Pileser king of Assyria), who took the Reubenites, the Gadites and the half-tribe of Manasseh into exile. He took them to Halah, Habor, Hara and the river of Gozan, where they are to this day.

[1Ch 12:18 NIV] 18 Then **the Spirit came on Amasai**, chief of the Thirty, and he said: "We are yours, David! We are with you, son of Jesse! Success, success to you, and success to those who help you, for your God will help you." So David received them and made them leaders of his raiding bands.

[1Ch 28:12 NIV] 12 He gave him the plans of all that **the Spirit had put in his mind** for the courts of the temple of the LORD and all the surrounding rooms, for the treasuries of the temple of God and for the treasuries for the dedicated things.

[2Ch 15:1-2 NIV] 1 The **Spirit of God came on Azariah** son of Oded. 2 He went out to meet Asa and said to him, "Listen to me, Asa and all Judah and Benjamin. **The LORD is with you when you are with him.** If you seek him, he will be found by you, but if you forsake him, he will forsake you.

[2Ch 20:14-15 NIV] 14 Then **the Spirit of the LORD came on Jahaziel** son of Zechariah, the son of Benaiah, the son of Jeiel, the son of Mattaniah, a Levite and descendant of Asaph, as he stood in the assembly. 15 He said: "Listen, King Jehoshaphat and all who live in Judah and Jerusalem! This is what the LORD says to you: **'Do not be afraid or discouraged** because of this vast army. For the battle is **not yours, but God's.**

[2Ch 24:20 NIV] 20 Then **the Spirit of God came on Zechariah** son of Jehoiada the priest. He stood before the people and said, "This is what God says: 'Why do you disobey the LORD's commands? **You will not prosper. Because you have forsaken the LORD, he has forsaken you.**' "

[Ecc 12:7 NIV] 7 and the dust returns to the ground it came from, and **the spirit returns to God who gave it.**

[Isa 11:1-5 NIV] 1 A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. 2 **The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him**--the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD-- 3 and he will delight in the fear of the LORD. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; 4 but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his

mouth; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked. 5 Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash around his waist.

[Isa 61:1-3 NIV] 1 The **Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me**, because the LORD has **anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, 2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, 3 and provide for those who grieve in Zion--to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor.**

[Isa 63:10-14 NIV] 10 **Yet they rebelled and grieved his Holy Spirit. So he turned and became their enemy and he himself fought against them.** 11 Then his people recalled the days of old, the days of Moses and his people--where is he who brought them through the sea, with the shepherd of his flock? **Where is he who set his Holy Spirit among them,** 12 who sent his glorious arm of power to be at Moses' right hand, who divided the waters before them, to gain for himself everlasting renown, 13 who led them through the depths? Like a horse in open country, they did not stumble; 14 like cattle that go down to the plain, they were **given rest by the Spirit of the LORD. This is how you guided your people** to make for yourself a glorious name.

[Jer 51:1 NIV] 1 This is what the LORD says: "See, I will **stir up** the spirit of a destroyer against Babylon and the people of Leb Kamai.

[Eze 2:2 NIV] 2 As he spoke, the Spirit **came into me and raised me** to my feet, and I heard him speaking to me.

[Eze 3:12, 14, 24 NIV] 12 Then the Spirit lifted me up, and I heard behind me a loud rumbling sound as the glory of the LORD rose from the place where it was standing. ... 14 The Spirit then **lifted me up and took me away**, and I went in bitterness and in the anger of my spirit, with the strong hand of the LORD on me. ... 24 Then the Spirit **came into me and raised me to my feet.** He spoke to me and said: "Go, shut yourself inside your house.

[Eze 8:3 NIV] 3 He stretched out what looked like a hand and took me by the hair of my head. The Spirit **lifted me up between earth and heaven and in visions of God he took me to Jerusalem**, to the entrance of the north gate of the inner court, where the idol that provokes to jealousy stood.

[Eze 11:1, 5, 24 NIV] 1 Then **the Spirit lifted me up and brought me to the gate** of the house of the LORD that faces east. There at the entrance of the gate were twenty-five men, and I saw among them Jaazaniah son of Azzur and Pelatiah son of Benaiah, leaders of the people. ... 5 Then the Spirit of the LORD **came on me, and he told me to say:** "This is what the LORD says: That is what you are saying, you leaders in Israel, but I know what is going through your mind. ... 24 **The Spirit lifted me up and brought me to the exiles** in Babylonia in **the vision given by the Spirit of God. Then the vision I had seen went up from me,**

[Eze 37:1 NIV] 1 The hand of the LORD was on me, and he **brought me out by the Spirit of the LORD and set me in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones.**

[Eze 43:5 NIV] 5 Then the Spirit **lifted me up and brought me into the inner court,** and the glory of the LORD filled the temple.

[Dan 4:8-9, 18 NIV] 8 Finally, Daniel came into my presence and I told him the dream. (He is called Belteshazzar, after the name of my god, and **the spirit of the holy gods is in him.**) 9 I said, "Belteshazzar, chief of the magicians, I know that **the spirit of the holy gods is in you, and no mystery is too difficult for you.** Here is my dream; interpret it for me. ... 18 "This is the dream that I, King Nebuchadnezzar, had. Now, Belteshazzar, tell me what it means, for none of the wise men in my kingdom can interpret it for me. **But you can, because the spirit of the holy gods is in you."**

[Dan 5:11, 14 NIV] 11 There is a man in your kingdom who has **the spirit of the holy gods in him.** In the time of your father he was found to **have insight and intelligence and wisdom** like that of the gods. Your father, King Nebuchadnezzar, appointed him chief of the magicians, enchanters, astrologers and diviners. ... 14 I have heard that the spirit of the gods is in you and that you have **insight, intelligence and outstanding wisdom.**

[Mic 3:5-8 NIV] 5 This is what the LORD says: "As for the **prophets** who lead my people astray, they proclaim '**peace**' if they have something to eat, **but prepare to wage war against** anyone who refuses to feed them. 6 Therefore night will come over you, **without visions, and darkness, without divination.** The sun will set for the prophets, and the day will go dark for them. 7 The seers will be ashamed and the diviners disgraced. They will all cover their faces because there is no answer from God." 8 But as for me, **I am filled with power, with the Spirit of the LORD,** and with justice and might, **to declare to Jacob his transgression, to Israel his sin.**

[Hag 1:14 NIV] 14 So the LORD **stirred up the spirit** of Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and the spirit of Joshua son of Jozadak, the high priest, and the spirit of the whole remnant of the people. **They came and began to work on the house of the LORD Almighty, their God,**

[Mat 3:16 NIV] 16 As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw **the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him.**

[Mat 4:1 NIV] 1 Then Jesus was **led by the Spirit** into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

[Mat 10:19-20 NIV] 19 But when they arrest you, do not worry about what to say or how to say it. At that time you will be given what to say, 20 for **it will not be you speaking, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you.**

[Mat 12:25-30 NIV] 25 Jesus knew their thoughts and said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself will be ruined, and every city or household divided against itself will not stand. 26 If Satan drives out Satan, he is divided against himself. How then can his kingdom stand? 27 And if I drive out demons by Beelzebul, by whom do your people drive them out? So then, they will be your judges. 28 But if it is **by the Spirit of God that I drive out demons**, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. 29 "Or again, how can anyone enter a strong man's house and carry off his possessions unless he first ties up the strong man? Then he can plunder his house. 30 "Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters.

[Mat 22:42-46 NIV] 42 "What do you think about the Messiah? Whose son is he?" "The son of David," they replied. 43 He said to them, "How is it then that David, **speaking by the Spirit**, calls him 'Lord'? For he says, 44 " 'The Lord said to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand until I put your enemies under your feet." ' 45 If then David calls him 'Lord,' how can he be his son?" 46 No one could say a word in reply, and from that day on no one dared to ask him any more questions.

[Luk 1:13, 17 NIV] 13 But the angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him John. ... 17 And he will go on before the Lord, **in the spirit and power of Elijah**, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous--to make ready a people prepared for the Lord."

Elijah = "my God is Jehovah"

[Luk 2:25-27 NIV] 25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem called **Simeon**, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and **the Holy Spirit was on him**. 26 It had been **revealed to him by the Holy Spirit** that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. 27 **Moved by the Spirit**, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required,

[Luk 4:1, 14 NIV] 1 **Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit**, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, ... 14 Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through the whole countryside.

[Jhn 1:29-34 NIV] 29 The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! 30 This is the one I meant when I said, 'A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.' 31 I myself did not know him, but the reason I came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel." 32 Then John gave this testimony: "**I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him**. 33 And I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is the one **who will baptize with the Holy Spirit**.' 34 I have seen and I testify that this is God's Chosen One."

[Jhn 3:5-6 NIV] 5 Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. 6 Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the **Spirit gives birth to spirit**.

[Jhn 3:31-36 NIV] 31 The one who comes from above (JESUS) is above all; the one who is from the earth (JOHN THE BAPTIZER) belongs to the earth, and speaks as one from the earth. The one who comes from heaven is above all. 32 He testifies to what he has seen and heard, but no one accepts his testimony. 33 Whoever has accepted it has certified that God is truthful. 34 For the one whom God has sent speaks the words of God, **for God gives the Spirit without limit**. 35 **The Father loves the Son and has placed everything in his hands**. 36 Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life, but **whoever rejects the Son will not see life, for God's wrath remains on them**.

[Jhn 4:23-24 NIV] 23 Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will **worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth**, for they are the kind of

worshipers the Father seeks. 24 **God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth.**"

[Jhn 6:63 NIV] 63 The **Spirit gives life**; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you--they are full of **the Spirit and life**.

[Jhn 7:39 NIV] 39 By this he meant **the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.**

[Jhn 14:17 NIV] 17 the **Spirit of truth**. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for **he lives with you and will be in you.**

[Jhn 14:6 NIV] 6 Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

[Jhn 15:26 NIV] 26 "When the Advocate comes, whom **I will send to you from the Father**--the Spirit of truth **who goes out from the Father**--he will testify about me(JESUS).

[Jhn 16:13, 15 NIV] 13 But when **he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth**. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and **he will tell you what is yet to come**. ... 15 All that belongs to the Father is mine. **That is why I said the Spirit will receive from me what he will make known to you."**

[Act 2:1-4, 32-33, 36-39, 41-43 NIV] 1 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. 2 Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. 4 All of them were **filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them**. ... 32 God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of it. 33 Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received **from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear**. ... 36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: **God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah.**" 37 When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" 38 Peter replied, **"Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you**

will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off--for all whom the Lord our God will call." ... 41 **Those who accepted his message were baptized**, and about three thousand were added to their number that day. 42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 **Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles.**

[Act 6:8-10 NIV] 8 Now Stephen, a man **full of God's grace and power**, performed great wonders and signs among the people. 9 Opposition arose, however, from members of the Synagogue of the Freedmen (as it was called)--Jews of Cyrene and Alexandria as well as the provinces of Cilicia and Asia--who began to argue with Stephen. 10 But they could not stand up against **the wisdom the Spirit gave him** as he spoke.

[Act 8:18, 29, 39 NIV] 18 When Simon saw that **the Spirit was given at the laying on of the apostles' hands**, he offered them money ... 29 **The Spirit told Philip**, "Go to that chariot and stay near it." ... 39 When they came up out of the water, the **Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away**, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing.

[Act 10:19 NIV] 19 While Peter was still thinking about the vision, **the Spirit said to him**, "Simon, three men are looking for you.

[Act 11:12, 28 NIV] 12 **The Spirit told me** to have no hesitation about going with them. These six brothers also went with me, and we entered the man's house. ... 28 One of them, named Agabus, stood up and through **the Spirit predicted** that a severe famine would spread over the entire Roman world. (This happened during the reign of Claudius.)

[Act 16:7, 18 NIV] 7 When they came to the border of Mysia, they tried to enter Bithynia, but **the Spirit of Jesus would not allow them to**. ... 18 She kept this up for many days. Finally Paul became so annoyed that he turned around and said to the spirit, "**In the name of Jesus Christ I command you to come out of her!**" **At that moment the spirit left her.**

[Act 20:22 NIV] 22 "And now, **compelled by the Spirit**, I am going to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there.

[Act 21:4 NIV] 4 We sought out the disciples there and stayed with them seven days. Through **the Spirit they urged Paul** not to go on to Jerusalem.

[Rom 2:29 NIV] 29 No, a person is a Jew who is one inwardly; and circumcision is circumcision of the heart, **by the Spirit**, not by the written code. Such a person's praise is not from other people, but from God.

[Rom 7:6 NIV] 6 But now, by dying to what once bound us, we have been released from the law so that we serve in the **new way of the Spirit**, and not in the old way of the written code.

[Rom 8:1-39 NIV] 1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are **in Christ Jesus**, 2 because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. 3 For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh, **God did by sending his own Son** in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in the flesh, 4 in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fully met in us, **who do not live according to the flesh but according to the Spirit**. 5 Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those **who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires**. 6 The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace. 7 The mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so. 8 Those who are in the realm of the flesh cannot please God. 9 You, however, are not in the realm of the flesh but are in the realm of the Spirit, **if indeed the Spirit of God lives in you**. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, they do not belong to Christ. 10 But if Christ is in you, then even though your body is subject to death because of sin, the Spirit gives life because of righteousness. 11 **And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you**, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you. 12 Therefore, brothers and sisters, **we have an obligation**--but it is not to the flesh, **to live according to it**. 13 For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live. 14 For those who are **led by the Spirit of God are the children of God**. 15 The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, **so that you live in fear again**; rather, the Spirit you received brought about **your adoption to sonship**. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father." 16 The **Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children**. 17 Now if we are children, **then we are heirs--heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ**, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory. 18 I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. 19 For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. 20 For the creation was subjected to frustration,

not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God. 22 We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. 23 Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. 24 For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? 25 But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently. 26 In the same way, **the Spirit helps us in our weakness.** We do not know what we ought to pray for, but **the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.** 27 And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because **the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God.** 28 And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, **who have been called according to his purpose.** 29 For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. 30 And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified. 31 What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? 32 He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all--how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? 33 Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. 34 Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died--more than that, who was raised to life--is at the right hand of God **and is also interceding for us.** 35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? 36 As it is written: "For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered." 37 No, in all these things **we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.** 38 For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to **separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.**

[Rom 8:27 NIV] 27 And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because **the Spirit intercedes for God's people** in accordance with the will of God.

[Rom 15:19 NIV] 19 by the power of signs and wonders, through **the power of the Spirit of God**. So from Jerusalem all the way around to Illyricum, I have fully proclaimed the gospel of Christ.

[1Co 2:10-11 NIV] 10 these are the things God has **revealed to us by his Spirit**. The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. 11 For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way **no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God**.

[1Co 2:12-15 NIV] 12 What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the **Spirit who is from God**, so that we may understand what God has freely given us. 13 This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words **taught by the Spirit**, explaining **spiritual realities** with Spirit-taught words. 14 **The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit**. 15 The person with the Spirit makes judgments about all things, but such a person is not subject to merely human judgments,

[1Co 6:11 NIV] 11 And that is what some of you were. But you were **washed, you were sanctified, you were justified** in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

[1Co 12:1-11 NIV] 1 Now about the **gifts of the Spirit**, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. 2 You know that when you were pagans, somehow or other you were influenced and led astray to mute idols. 3 Therefore I want you to know that **no one who is speaking by the Spirit of God says, "Jesus be cursed," and no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit**. 4 There are different kinds of gifts, but **the same Spirit distributes them**. 5 There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. 6 There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work. 7 Now to each one **the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good**. 8 To one there is given through the Spirit **a message of wisdom**, to another **a message of knowledge** by means of the same Spirit, 9 to another **faith** by the same Spirit, to another **gifts of healing** by that one Spirit, 10 to another **miraculous powers**, to another **prophecy**, to another **distinguishing between spirits**, to another **speaking in different kinds of tongues**, and to still another **the interpretation of tongues**. 11 All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.

[1Co 14:1-33 NIV] 1 Follow the way of love and **eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit, especially prophecy.** 2 For anyone who speaks in a tongue does not speak to people but to God. Indeed, no one understands them; they utter mysteries by the Spirit. 3 But **the one who prophesies speaks to people for their strengthening, encouraging and comfort.** 4 Anyone who speaks in a tongue edifies themselves, but the one who prophesies edifies the church. 5 I would like every one of you to speak in tongues, but I would rather have you prophesy. The one who prophesies is greater than the one who speaks in tongues, unless someone interprets, so that the church may be edified. 6 Now, brothers and sisters, if I come to you and speak in tongues, what good will I be to you, unless I bring you some revelation or knowledge or prophecy or word of instruction? 7 Even in the case of lifeless things that make sounds, such as the pipe or harp, how will anyone know what tune is being played unless there is a distinction in the notes? 8 Again, if the trumpet does not sound a clear call, who will get ready for battle? 9 So it is with you. Unless you speak intelligible words with your tongue, how will anyone know what you are saying? You will just be speaking into the air. 10 Undoubtedly there are all sorts of languages in the world, yet none of them is without meaning. 11 If then I do not grasp the meaning of what someone is saying, I am a foreigner to the speaker, and the speaker is a foreigner to me. 12 So it is with you. **Since you are eager for gifts of the Spirit, try to excel in those that build up the church.** 13 For this reason the one who speaks in a tongue should pray that they may interpret what they say. 14 For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my mind is unfruitful. 15 So what shall I do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will also pray with my understanding; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my understanding. 16 Otherwise when you are praising God in the Spirit, how can someone else, who is now put in the position of an inquirer, say "Amen" to your thanksgiving, since they do not know what you are saying? 17 You are giving thanks well enough, but no one else is edified. 18 I thank God that I speak in tongues more than all of you. 19 But in the church I would rather speak five intelligible words to instruct others than ten thousand words in a tongue. 20 Brothers and sisters, stop thinking like children. In regard to evil be infants, but in your thinking be adults. 21 In the Law it is written: "With other tongues and through the lips of foreigners I will speak to this people, but even then they will not listen to me, says the Lord." 22 Tongues, then, are a sign, not for believers but for unbelievers; **prophecy, however, is not for unbelievers but for believers.** 23 So if the whole church comes together and everyone speaks in tongues, and inquirers or unbelievers come in, will they not say that you are out of your mind? 24 But if an unbeliever or an inquirer comes in while

everyone is prophesying, they are convicted of sin and are brought under judgment by all, 25 as the secrets of their hearts are laid bare. So they will fall down and worship God, exclaiming, "God is really among you!" 26 What then shall we say, brothers and sisters? **When you come together, each of you has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation.** **Everything must be done so that the church may be built up.** 27 If anyone speaks in a tongue, two--or at the most three--should speak, one at a time, and someone must interpret. 28 If there is no interpreter, the speaker should keep quiet in the church and speak to himself and to God. 29 Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should weigh carefully what is said. 30 And if a revelation comes to someone who is sitting down, the first speaker should stop. 31 For you can all prophesy in turn so that everyone may be instructed and encouraged. 32 The spirits of prophets are subject to the control of prophets. 33 **For God is not a God of disorder but of peace--as in all the congregations of the Lord's people.**

[2Co 3:18 NIV] 18 And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, **are being transformed into his image** with ever-increasing glory, which **comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.**

[2Co 5:5 NIV] 5 Now the one who has fashioned us for this very purpose is God, who **has given us the Spirit as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come.**

[2Co 11:3-4, 14-15 NIV] 3 But I am afraid that just as Eve was deceived by the serpent's cunning, your minds may somehow be led astray from your sincere and pure devotion to Christ. 4 For if someone comes to you and preaches a Jesus other than the Jesus we preached, or if you **receive a different spirit from the Spirit you received**, or a different gospel from the one you accepted, you put up with it easily enough. ... 14 And no wonder, for Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light. 15 It is not surprising, then, if his servants also masquerade as servants of righteousness. Their end will be what their actions deserve.

[Gal 3:2-3, 14 NIV] 2 I would like to learn just one thing from you: Did you **receive the Spirit** by the works of the law, or by **believing what you heard?** 3 Are you so foolish? After beginning by means of the Spirit, are you now trying to finish by means of the flesh? ... 14 He redeemed us in order that the blessing given to Abraham might come to the Gentiles through Christ Jesus, so that by faith we might receive the promise of the Spirit.

[Gal 4:1-7 NIV] 1 What I am saying is that as long as an heir is underage, he is no different from a slave, although he owns the whole estate. 2 The heir is subject to guardians and trustees **until the time set by his father**. 3 So also, when we were underage, **we were in slavery under the elemental spiritual forces of the world**. 4 But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, 5 to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship. 6 Because you are his sons, **God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "Abba, Father."** 7 So you are no longer a slave, but God's child; and since you are his child, God has made you also an heir.

[Gal 5:13-26 NIV] 13 You, my brothers and sisters, **were called to be free**. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, **serve one another humbly in love**. 14 For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." 15 If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other. 16 So I say, **walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh**. 17 For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, **so that you are not to do whatever you want**. 18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. 19 The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; 20 idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions 21 and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. **I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God**. 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. 24 **Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires**. 25 Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. 26 Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.

[Gal 6:1, 7-8 NIV] 1 Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who **live by the Spirit** should restore that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted. ... 7 Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. 8 Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life.

[Eph 1:17-23 NIV] 17 I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, **may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you**

may know him better. 18 I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, 19 and his incomparably **great power for us who believe.** That power is the same as the mighty strength 20 he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, 21 far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. 22 And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, 23 which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way.

[Eph 2:1-22 NIV] 1 As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, 2 in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. 3 All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath. 4 But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, 5 made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions--it is by grace you have been saved. 6 And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, 7 in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. **8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith--and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-- 9 not by works, so that no one can boast.** 10 For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. 11 Therefore, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called "uncircumcised" by those who call themselves "the circumcision" (which is done in the body by human hands)-- 12 remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. 13 But now **in Christ Jesus** you who once were far away have been **brought near by the blood of Christ.** 14 For he himself is our peace, **who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility,** 15 by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations. **His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace,** 16 and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. 17 He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. 18 **For through him we both have**

access to the Father by one Spirit. 19 Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, 20 built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. 21 In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. 22 And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.

[Eph 3:4-6 NIV] 4 In reading this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, 5 which was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been **revealed by the Spirit to God's holy apostles and prophets.** 6 This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus.

[Eph 6:11-18 NIV] 11 Put on the full **armor of God**, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. 13 Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. 14 Stand firm then, with the belt of **truth** buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of **righteousness** in place, 15 and with your feet fitted with the **readiness** that comes from the gospel of **peace**. 16 In addition to all this, take up the shield of **faith**, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. 17 Take the helmet of **salvation** and **the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.** 18 And **pray in the Spirit** on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

[2Th 2:13 NIV] 13 But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters loved by the Lord, because God chose you as firstfruits to be saved through the **sanctifying work of the Spirit** and through belief in the truth.

[2Th 2:13-14 NIV] 13 But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters loved by the Lord, because God chose you as firstfruits to be saved **through the sanctifying work of the Spirit** and through belief in the truth. 14 He called you to this through our gospel, that you might share in the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.

[1Ti 4:1 NIV] 1 **The Spirit clearly says** that in later times some will abandon the faith and follow deceiving spirits and things taught by demons.

[Heb 10:24-29 NIV] 24 And let us consider how we may **spur one another on toward love and good deeds**, 25 not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but **encouraging one another**--and all the more as you see the Day approaching. 26 **If we deliberately keep on sinning after we have received the knowledge of the truth, no sacrifice for sins is left, 27 but only a fearful expectation of judgment and of raging fire that will consume the enemies of God.** 28 Anyone who rejected the law of Moses died without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses. 29 How much more severely do you think someone deserves to be punished who has trampled the Son of God underfoot, who has treated as an unholy thing the blood of the covenant that sanctified them, and who has insulted the Spirit of grace?

[Jas 2:26 NIV] 26 As the body **without the spirit** is dead, so faith **without deeds** is dead.

[Jas 4:4-8 NIV] 4 You adulterous people, don't you know that friendship with the world means enmity against God? Therefore, anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God. 5 Or do you think Scripture says without reason that **he jealously longs for the spirit** he has caused to dwell in us? 6 But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says: "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble." 7 Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. 8 Come near to God and he will come near to you. Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded.

[1Pe 3:18 NIV] 18 For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but **made alive in the Spirit.**

[1Jo 3:24 NIV] 24 The **one who keeps God's commands lives in him**, and he in them. And this is how we know that he lives in us: We know it by the Spirit he gave us.

[1Jo 4:2-3 NIV] 2 This is **how you can recognize the Spirit of God**: Every spirit that **acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God**, 3 but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world.

[1Jo 5:18-19 NIV] 18 We know that anyone **born of God** does not continue to sin; the **One who was born of God keeps them safe**, and the evil one cannot harm them. 19 We know that **we are children of God**, and that the whole world is under the control of the evil one.

[Rev 22:17 NIV] 17 The Spirit and the bride say, "Come!" And let the one who hears say, "Come!" Let the one who is thirsty come; and let the one who wishes take the **free gift of the water of life**.
